## Reading for pleasure

Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures. In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background.

We continue to instil into the children the importance of reading. The lunchtime book club, reading plus intervention, reading buddies and the in school bookshop all give the children the opportunity to read for pleasure outside of the classroom. Our recent World Book Day celebrations have helped to raise the profile of reading within school further. We are hugely grateful to Paul Atkinson, manager of WHSmith in the Metro Centre, who came into school and gave every child a book to help celebrate World Book Day. We also thank you the parents for supporting your children in getting involved. Each class held a competition linked to some aspect of World Book Day and congratulations to the winners, who all received a book as a prize. Their photos are displayed in the main admin corridor.

The Book Fair was once again well supported and we managed to raise £716.34 in commission which we will be using to update the non-fiction books in the library. This is a fantastic effort and we would like to thank you for attending the Book Fair with your child.

Our Road to Reading competition has been launched where each class will compete on a weekly basis to have the most number of children reading. We are aware that the lure of electronic gadgets is much more attractive to some children than books, however we would urge you to continue to hear your child read on a regular basis, even when they enter KS2, and mark it in their diary so that they can feel part of the competition. We would urge you to encourage your child to read a range of books, comics, newspapers—anything that will help them to grow as readers.

You can make a huge difference! Parents are the most important educators in a child's life - even more important than their teachers - and it's never too early to start reading together.

# If you think you are (or would be) entitled to Free School Meals please fill in the form

If your child is in Years 3-6 and you think you are entitled to free school meals, please contact the school office to request a claim form. Your child could get extra funding to support their learning within school.

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and is already receiving the free meals provided, but you would have been entitled, please also contact the school office and request the form anyway.

Even if you do not wish your child to take the school meal, our school will benefit from the grant attached to each pupil who is eligible to free school meals.

Currently, this is worth £1,320 per pupil per year and would be a huge loss to the school if parents do not claim. If eligible your child will receive the money on an annual basis until they leave primary school.

## Healthy Food Policy

The school's healthy food policy has recently been updated and can be found on the school website. Please be aware that we have a number of children in school with food allergies so we would ask you to be mindful when you are sending in treats for your children's birthdays or when sending snacks in for break time. We are a healthy school so we would ask that any cereal bars that are sent in for break time are checked for their sugar content.
