Attendance Policy

A quick reminder that holiday in term time is not allowed by this Government unless there are exceptional circumstances. As harsh as it may seem, having an affordable holiday or set work holidays are not considered exceptional. Some Penalty Notices have already been issued to parents who have taken their children on holiday without school's permission. This costs £60 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, and £120 if paid between 21 and 28 days. This can add up to a considerable amount. Our Family Liaison worker, Mrs. Conroy, monitors our attendance very closely and

any parents of children whose attendance is a concern may be invited to the Governor attendance panel.

Cycling events

Jayne Stanton (Dr Bike) was in school on Monday 14th October to fix any bikes or scooters that needed attention. She also spoke to the children about bike safety and how they can keep themselves safe in the dark nights when walking or cycling to school.

As part of our continuing promotion of cycling, Jayne will be in school from 29th Oct—1st Nov offering scooter and cycling skills and games for your child. Children taking part will need a two wheeled bike or scooter of their own in safe working order, and a helmet. Other appropriate clothing, such as a short length coat and trainers is desirable. A pair of gloves can also be very useful for avoiding minor scrapes.
