As part of our safeguarding curriculum this term, pupils in KS1 and KS2 have had visits from the RNLI to highlight the dangers of water when at the beach. The children were taught what to do if they were caught in a current when swimming in the sea and about the different meanings of flags they see at the beach. They also learnt about what they would need to take out if they were going to save someone and what to do if they got cold water shock. Feedback from the children was very positive and I would like to thank the RNLI for their support in educating the children about safety at sea.
