<b>Literacy</b>	Listen to the story: The Night Before Christmas, Read By Justin Fletcher. Can they retell the story. Ask your child to draw a scene from the story. Can they attempt to label it? for example, Santa, red hat and gift.  REMEMBER: this is a task of sounding out words, and writing them, not copying writing.  Encourage good pencil grip /control and correct letter formation.	Listen to the story: The Night Before Christmas, Read By Justin Fletcher. Ask your child to draw the scene where Santa is in the sled. Underneath ask your child to write a sentence. ‘Santa on a red sled’. (If you feel your child needs further challenge, try writing – Santa on a big red sled). REMEMBER: this is a task of sounding out words, and writing them, not copying writing.  Encourage good pencil grip /control and correct letter formation.	Set the scene. Even Elves write a letter to Santa. Poor Eddie elf needs help to write his list for Santa. Ch to help write the words to match the picture on the list. Use the letter <a href="#">Dear Santa Letters CRA20</a> or maybe make your own,	<a href="#">Elf on a shelf - writing a sentence CRA20</a> Use the elf on the shelf sentence writing sheet to talk about the picture. Use the sheet or ask your child to draw their own elf on the shelf. Ask your child to write: “An elf on a shelf.” Your child could even give the elf a name.
