## What is phonics?



# Phonics is a systematic approach to help children read and write

- There are 26 letters in the alphabet.
- The letters in the alphabet make up phonemes (sounds) and graphemes (a number of letters that represent a sound).

For example: mat m - a - t ship sh - i - p



A good example of a grapheme is the sound 'ie' which can be written in many other ways:

ie	i-e	У	igh
pie tie	rice hide	cry dye	high might
die	nice	why	sigh
fried	ride	by	night
	pipe	bye	fight

#### High Frequency words

•Children need to learn and be able to read all of these words, and eventually spell them.

•Green words - can be Fred talked.

•Red words - Don't fit into usual spelling patterns. They are tricky and it is necessary for children to know some words are "tricky" and can't be sounded out.

## When will my child bring a reading book home?



- Children are assessed frequently. Reading books will be sent home when they have the skills to access the reading books.
- Some children will access reading books after half term. For other children it may take a while longer.
- Reading books will match the children's reading skills. We may send home picture books, sound recognition books and books with words in.
