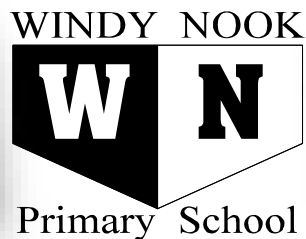

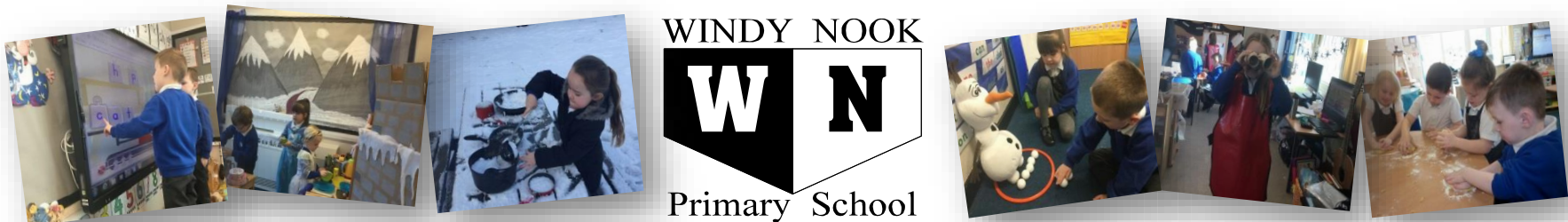

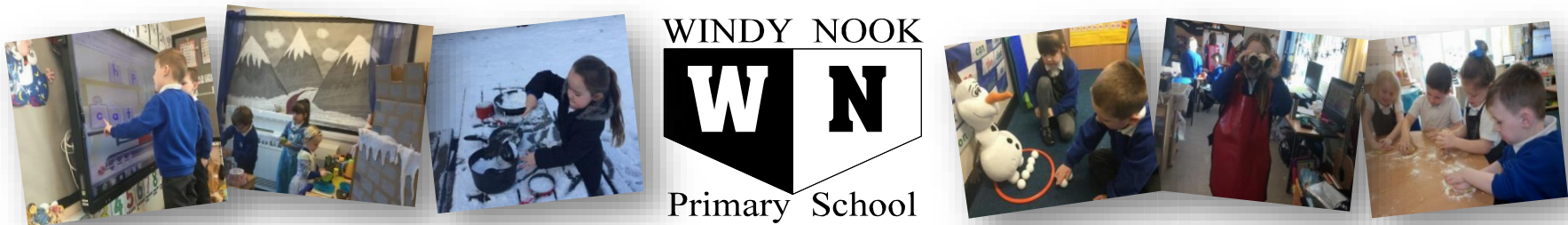


Preparing your child for School

- recognise numerals 1-10





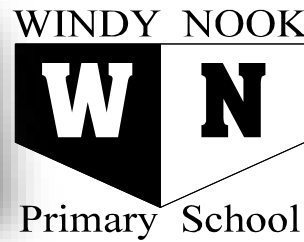

Primary School

General Information

- School lunches are universally free until your child goes into Year 3. If you wish, your child may bring a packed lunch.
- Children are offered fruit for a snack every morning. We ask that you provide water. Please note we are a healthy school and juice is not permitted.
- Children are not allowed to wear jewellery.
- Please send your child into school every Friday wearing their PE kit. Please note that PE will sometimes take place outdoors therefore we advise your child wear joggers / leggings and a hoodie or school jumper.
- If your child needs medication please contact the school office and fill in the relevant paper work.



The Great Outdoors!

Please provide your child with:

- A warm and waterproof coat every day (even on sunny days)
- Wellington boots when raining or snowing
- Hats and gloves in cold weather (no scarves)
- Sun cream (applied before school)
- A cap in sunnier weather

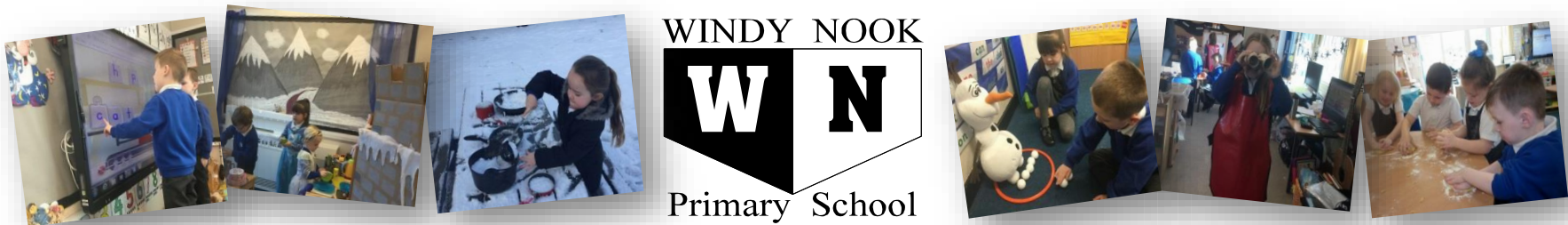
School Uniform

- Blue cardigan or jumper with school logo
- Black shoes
- Book bag & PE bag

If you wish to speak to a member of staff please wait until all children are in the classroom and a member of staff will be happy to speak to you.



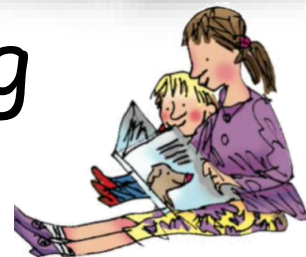

Phonics and Early Reading



Reading books will be sent home when they have the skills to access the reading books. Reading books will match the children's reading skills. We may send home picture books, sound recognition books, and books with words in. Some children will bring home games to help with letter recognition and practise with blending words.

Reading homework and library books will be sent out every Friday. Please return the blue record book and reading books every Wednesday.
