Punctuality Reminders

Good school attendance includes being there on time. The habit of good punctuality in primary school will help your child throughout their education and on into adult life and the work place.

Lateness = Lost Learning Did you know that

5 mins late each day 3 days lost! 10 mins late each day 6.5 days lost! 15 mins late each day 10 days lost! 20 mins late each day 13 days lost! 30 mins late each day 19 days lost!

30 mins late each day 19 days lost!

Danger Zone: As few as 19 missed days over the school year reduces your chances of success.

Please ensure your child comes to school on time.

*(Figures are calculated over a school year)

We have a small number of families who are consistently late for school. This is not only distressing for your child but wastes a huge amount of office staff time and disrupts the learning of the rest of the children in their class. Mrs. Conroy monitors this on a weekly basis and if your child continues to be late you can be

referred to the Legal Intervention Team for prosecution.
