Holidays in term time — Changes to Penalty Notice Code of Conduct

The National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence will come into effect from 19th August 2024, and the local Gateshead Code of Conduct has been updated to reflect the new framework.

The significant changes are:

New national threshold—There will be a new single consistent national threshold for Penalty Notices of 10 unauthorised sessions within a rolling 10 school week period. This is a change from Gateshead's current threshold of 10 unauthorised absences in 12 weeks.

Increase in penalty amount

An increase to the rate of a penalty notice from £120 if paid within 28 days, reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days to £160 if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

Abolition Warning Letter

Parents will no longer receive a Warning Letter for the first unauthorised leave of absence referral, as per current Code of Conduct; all parents will be issued with a Penalty Notice at the first referral.

School Trip voluntary contributions

As more school trips begin to take place, we would like to remind you that although we request payment by voluntary contribution, if enough contributions are not made to cover the cost of the trip then it cannot go ahead and the trip will be cancelled.

Punctuality

Good school attendance includes being there on time. The habit of good punctuality in primary school will help your child throughout their education and on into adult life and the work

place. Lateness = Lost Learning Did you know that

5 mins late each day 3 days lost! 10 mins late each day 6.5 days lost! 15 mins late each day 10 days lost! 20 mins late each day 13 days lost! 30 mins late each day 19 days lost!

Danger Zone: As few as 19 missed days over the school year reduces your chances of success.

Please ensure your child comes to school on time.

*(Figures are calculated over a school year)

We have a small number of families who are consistently late for school. This is not only distressing for your child but wastes a huge amount of office staff time and disrupts the learning of the rest of the children in their class. Mrs. Conroy monitors this on a weekly basis and if your child continues to be late you can be referred to the Legal

Intervention Team for prosecution.
Entry via the school gates is restricted from 8:45. Any child coming in through the main school entrance is recorded in the late book.
