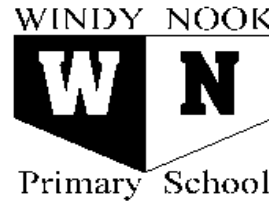

All lessons to have daily 'Speed Calc' sessions (3 calculation, 1 shape and space and 1 maths facts). They will also have a quickfire 'times tables' session.

Science coverage

Week 1: Explain that light travels in a straight line from light sources to our eyes .

Week 2: Understand how mirrors reflect light, and how they help us see objects.

Week 3: Investigate how refraction changes the direction in which light travels.

Week 4: investigate how a prism changes a ray of light to show the spectrum.

Week 5: Investigate how light enables us to see colours .

Week 6: Explain why shadows have the same shapes as the objects that casts them .

This half term we will be learning about World War I in the context of Windy Nook and the experience of our local area. We will explore the lives of notable figures from around Gateshead and learn about how the First World War affected those involved. In computing, we will be looking at using micro: bits. Our Science topic is based on light and we will investigate the effect of refraction and prisms. In RE, we will be continuing our focus on Christianity and look at it through the lens of art and music. Athletics will be our PE this half term.
