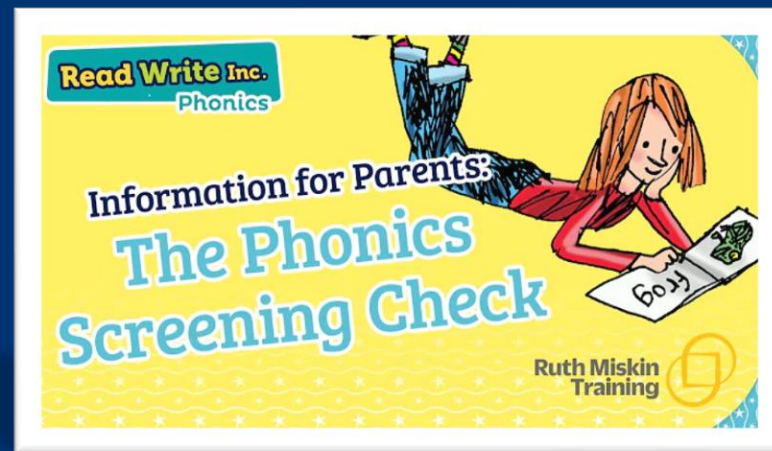


## Year 1 Phonics Screen Check Parent Information Meeting





## What is the Phonics Screening Check?

- Children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in June.
- The check is designed to give teachers information on how your child is progressing in phonics.
- Mrs Ramanandi carries out the screening check.
- Children who pass the check score between 32 / 40 words. Those who do not pass will complete a recheck next summer.
- The check is designed to give teachers information on how your child is progressing in phonics. It will help to identify whether your child needs additional support at this stage so that they do not fall behind in this vital early reading skill.
- The phonics screening check contains 40 words. They are divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and pseudo-words (nonsense words which do not have a meaning).

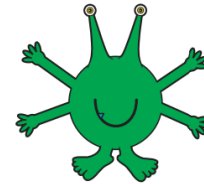

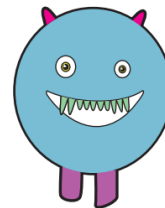

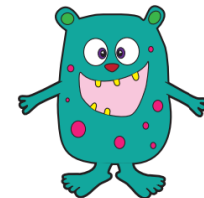

***Special friends***

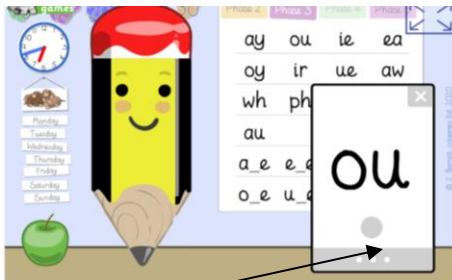
***Fred talk***

- Previous Phonics Screening Check booklets are available on the school website to print off or use electronically. We will also send a copy of one of these practice booklets via Arbor each week this half term.

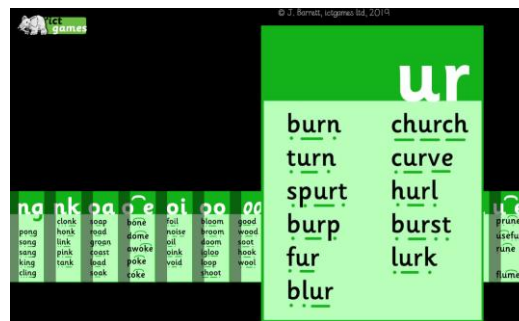
